- COD Indio Campus two large buildings under construction
- Public Safety Campus under construction 911 dispatch center, public safety services building and a new fire station
- New City Hall and new Library in Downtown construction will commence next year
- Downtown "Outdoor Living Room" stage and park as an entertainment venue
- 4 restaurants opening up Downtown, with more to follow
- Over \$10M of street paving
- Replacement of all public street signs
- Re-landscaping of Hwy 111 medians and upgrades to medians at Jefferson, Jackson, Ave.

- Begin construction of Sports Complex on Jackson grant funded
- Construction beautification improvements along Jackson from 44 to I-10 grant funded
- Begin construction on Downtown storm drain system grant funded
- Façade improvement program for Downtown and Highway 111 businesses (\$500k and \$700k, respectively)
- Commence construction of the John Nobles Memorial Park (behind the Indio Grand Marketplace that will have façade improvements)
